



MEDSTATS


Medstats is a tool for individuals and their families to provide important information to assist first responders and hospital personnel when someone needs medical assistance, transportation to the hospital or hospitalization.

MEDSTATS

Information that is needed to complete a
Medstats I.C.E. form

- ▶ Current personal information.
 - ▶ Current contact information of individuals to contact in an emergency.
 - ▶ Current medical conditions

- ▶ Current medications
 - ▶ Current allergies to medications
 - ▶ Any special considerations
 - ▶ Doctors contact information
 - ▶ Insurance information

Preparing your Medstats I.C.E. document

When preparing your Medstats I.C.E document, the document can be filled out with the online PDF format, saved and stored electronically and then printed.

A printed I.C.E. document should be kept in a safe place that is easily accessible to First Responders, family members or individuals who might be talking with First Responders or hospital personnel.

MEDSTATS

A very important document(s) that should be considered with every Medstats is a:

Medical Power of Attorney (MPoA) and Medical Directives

This document gives individuals legal rights to make important medical decisions if the patient is not able to make those decisions. It also informs medical personnel what pertinent medical directives that the patient or families wishes. Please refer to the AZ Attorney General website for the correct MPoA and Medical Directives to complete for the Medstats I.C.E.
